The season of Advent begins this year on December 3rd. "Advent" means "coming," "arrival," and as such, both points toward a celebration of God's coming into the world through the birth of his



son at Christmas two thousand years ago and the promise of his final return in triumph at the end of days. The season looks backward and forward at the same time, the two events finding their connection in the present.

On the one hand, we celebrate an event from the past as an experienced anticipation in the present, counting down not the remaining shopping days until Christmas, but the remaining days of growing expectation and longing until the advent of the joy of new birth, the dawning of the light, the arrival of the fullness of Divinity in the reality of humanity, which is celebrated in Christmas. In the ritualized days of the Season of Advent we experience the anticipation of the past as a present anticipation.

Each Sunday for four weeks we light a candle on the Advent wreath, each Sunday the glow growing with additional candles, getting brighter and brighter, until finding its culmination on Christmas Eve in the Christ candle haloed and surrounded by the combined light of all four candles of the season. In the ritual of the season, we experience what has already been as happening anew in our life—the birth of Christ not occurring two thousand years ago, but right now in our lives, in our midst, in our community.

On the other hand, in Advent we also celebrate an event that has not yet happened as partially fulfilled in the anticipation of the present, looking forward toward the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God, when Justice shall reign, and every tear be dried, and the swords beaten down into plowshares. As a community we tend and nourish our longing and hope, we huddle in the glow of God's Promise, building one another up, exhorting each other toward acts of kindness and love, keeping the hope alive in our shared longing, our shared pining, our shared hunger.

In remembering Jesus' promised return, we remember that God is not yet finished with us or his creation, that the status quo is not all that can be hoped for or expected. In remembering Jesus' promised return, we look forward with longing to the final vindication of hope and the triumph of love. In Advent, we experience, if not the fulfillment of this promise, then the palpable vitality of this promise, the life-giving power of this promise. In Advent this power is made manifest to us in the experience of anticipation.

In the ritualized days of the Season of Advent, past and future meet in the shared experience of the community in the present. These are strange days indeed, marked in sacred time by the church in worship and fellowship. May we have eyes to see and ears to hear! --- Stan

# **MUSIC NOTES from Megan**

"Whom do you see? Shepherds, tell us!"
-from "Christmas Cantata" by Daniel Pinkham

The choir, Sergei, and I are excited to bring the "Christmas Cantata" by Daniel Pinkham as part of our Advent journey in December. Composed in 1957, Daniel Pinkham was an organist, harpsichordist, teacher, and composer in the Boston area for the bulk of his career. He was a regular performer with the Boston Symphony Orchestra and was the staff organist at King's Chapel in Boston for forty-two years.

The text comes from three Christmas Eve texts centering around Shepherds, Baby Jesus in the Manger, and a multitude of Angels in the Sky, and encompasses fanfare, plainchant (utilizing the Dorian mode – known for "mystery" in church music), and Renaissance dance.

Being a New England composer and a student of composition at Tanglewood, you can hear influence from Aaron Copland, Samuel Barber, and Nadia Boulanger.

We, at First Presbyterian, will present "Christmas Cantata" with full choir, organ, and a brass choir.

As you make your way through Advent and into Christmas, the music staff at FPC hopes that we offer you moments of awe and wonder to enliven your spiritual journey.








# Tuesday January 2, 7:00 p.m. on Zoom The Wish Book Christmas by Lynn Austin





# Tuesday February 6, 7:00 p.m. on Zoom The Black Count: Glory, Revolution, Betrayal, and the Real Count of Monte Cristo by Tom Reiss

General Alex Dumas is a man almost unknown today, yet his story is strikingly familiar—because his son, the novelist Alexandre Dumas, used his larger-than-life feats as inspiration for such classics as *The Count of Monte Christo* and *The Three Musketeers*. But, hidden behind General Dumas's swashbuckling adventures was an even more incredible secret: he was the son of a black slave—who rose higher in the white world of France than any man of his race



prior to current times. *The Black Count* is simultaneously a riveting adventure story and a window into the modern world's first multi-racial society. But it is also a heartbreaking story of the enduring bonds of love between a father and son.

### First Sunday of Advent, December 3, 2023

Stir up your power and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open, to cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the

suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

### Second Sunday of Advent, December 10, 2023

John calls people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing gets in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We

say it to one another in worship, to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.

### Third Sunday of Advent, December 17, 2023

"Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the words of a spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes we are happy to wear. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God's party.

### **Christmas is coming!**

# **SESSION NOTES - December 2023**

The Session of First Presbyterian Church of Lansing met at the church for its regular meeting Wednesday, 15 November 2023. Rev. Stanley Jenkins presided as moderator.

Prospective new members Natasha & Desmond Ferguson were invited to speak about their background and faith journeys, and their wish to join First Pres. After very brief deliberation Session approved their membership and welcomed them to the church.

The Finance Committee reported that the projected deficit is improving, but it is too soon to know by how much. Parking paid by state workers and contractors continues to be a welcome source of revenue, and careful budget reductions have helped to close the gap. Session also approved a motion by the Building & Grounds Committee to sell the aging and little-used church van.

A first-draft budget for 2024 was presented, based on committee budget input. The draft budget is nearly the same overall amount as the 2023 budget, but discussions are ongoing. The annual pledge campaign is now underway, with Commitment Sunday November 19.

Ordination and Installation of newly elected elders and deacons is planned for Sunday December 10.
